All Livery hab e Keepers failing to make the return required in the 3d Section of this Ordinance, shall, in addition to the foregoing, be subject to a penalty of not exceeding firy dollars, all of which penalty shall be recovered before the Mayor, or one of the Addermen of said city, by summary ornviction; and it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to seek out all persons who have failed to comply with any of the provistons of this Ordinance and report the same to the City Treasurer, for which service he shall receive the sum of fifty cents in each case, to be taxed and collected as part of the costs, upon conviction as aforesaid.
