The markets, in a general way, are devoid of anything that is really new or important. There is a general complaint in commercial circles of business being dull and times hard; money tight and collections very hard to make.

APPLES—Are coming in more freely, but with a steady demand, prices are maintained, ranging from 40¢ per bushel, as to quality.

BACON—In good supply and rather dull but unchanged; \$3.50 to the trade, and \$3.75 in a retail way.
