

PITTSBURGH MARKETS.

Business, although improving slightly, is still very dull, and our merchants generally continue to complain of hard times. For some few articles there is a better demand, but as a general thing, it is light, and confined almost entirely to supplying immediate wants; so far as values are concerned, there are no important changes, one way or the other.

There is such a strong competition in nearly all branches of business here that margins are very light, and it would appear that the only way to make almost any kind of business pay is to do a good deal of it—"small profits and quick returns."

Money continues tight, and there is a general complaint in regard to the difficulty in making collections. APPLS.—Very scarce, particularly in sound condition; we continue to quote at \$6.50 per bush.

APPLE BUTTER—90¢ per gallon. BUTTER.—Notwithstanding our arrivals continue liberal, the market is steady and prices unchanged, 45¢ per pound for choice No. 1.

BEANS.—Market almost bare; small sales New York Green at 24¢. CORN.—In still at 22¢ per bush. CRANBERRIES.—None in market.
