Washington Items.

A son of Col. Forney, of the Chronicle goes with Gov. Curtis to St. Petersburg, as Secretary of Legation. D. B. Forney, a brother of the Colonel, is a candidate for the Washington postoffice, but it is promised to Robbins if the incumbent is removed.

The President has solved the vexed question—can a negro hold office in Georgia—in a very practical manner, by appointing Edward Belcher, an intelligent liberal, to the office of Assessor of Internal Revenue for the Third District of that State. Unpleasant rumors have been circulating to the effect that the President is about to remove Belcher, and that he is to be replaced by a man of color, but it is believed that the President will stand by his appointment.

An unsuccessful effort was made at the commencement of the executive session, by requesting from American Ministers and Secretaries of Legation at least a knowledge of the language of the country. This custom, which is inexorably enforced by all foreign Governments, failed in consequence of the alleged exigencies of the party, and the necessity of providing prompt public men, irrespective of merit or special adaptation for their functions abroad.

The story of a disagreement between Secretary Fish and the President on the Cuban matter is a preposterous one. Both are agreed that the Government cannot interpose for the Cuban people the same force, and Senator Sumner takes the same position. All three hold that it would be unwise for the United States to take the administration will act promptly, and its advice is that there is little chance of such a result in certain newspapers.
