PETROLEUM MARKET, OFFICE OF PITTSBURGH GAZETTE, SATURDAY, APRIL 24, 1898. Receipts of Crude this week, 11,078; last week, 13,222; from January last, 553,021. Exports Refined this week, 10,045; last week, 7,902; from January last, 1,750,000. Sales this week, 30,000; last week, 42,200. From the above it will be seen that the receipts of Crude this far this year are 185,220 bbls below those of the same time last year, while the shipments of Refined are 10,045 larger than for the corresponding time last year.

The money market was unusually easy and there were lower rates of interest than for a long time. Early call loans were made at 9 per cent, but soon fell to 6 per cent, and before three o'clock money was offered freely at 2 1/2 per cent, with considerable transactions thereat. The supply of capital is largely in excess of the demand, and all indications favor a continued ease in the future if the market is left to its natural course.
