

PRESBYTERIAN UNITY.

The new basis of Union was adopted by the Old School Assembly unanimously...

INSURANCE.

Each Presbytery of the separate Churches shall be entitled to the same representation in the Assembly of the United Church in 1870 as it is entitled in the Assembly with which it is now connected.

As there are matters pertaining to the interests of the Church which shall have become reamitted, which will manifestly require adjustment on the coming together of two bodies which have so long acted separately...

1. All the ministers and churches embracing the two bodies should be admitted to the same standing in the united body which they may have held in their respective connection up to the consummation of the union.

2. Imperfectly organized churches are to be re-established or to become thoroughly Presbyterian as early within the period of five years as may be permitted, and no other such churches shall be hereafter received.

3. The boundaries of the several Presbyteries and Synods should be adjusted by the General Assembly of the United Church.

4. The official records of the two branches of the Church for the period of separation should be preserved and held as making up the one history of the Church; and no rule or precedent which does not stand approved by both the bodies, should be of any authority except in so far as such rule or precedent may affect the rights of property founded thereon.
