Messrs. Editors: Doubtless your readers would be pleased to hear once in many years from the quiet, unassuming little village of Murdocksville.

The other day we published an item declaring that a machine had been invented for boring oil wells in a new and improved manner. The Timesville Herald describes it.

On the flats in Oil City there is an operating new machine for drilling oil wells, which obviates the use of the engine, walking beam, &c., and the ordinary derrick. So far as we can determine it will answer the purpose quite as well as they do.

The machine consists of a revolving circular platform, a derrick constructed of a pole and wire supports, two wheels which serve as a hand and foot wheel, and a pitman. The wheels, derrick and pitman, and other apparatus, such as reels and cables, are situated on the platform, and the whole is turned by horse power.

The manner in which the conductor is driven and the drill operated is simple and ingenious. The conductor is placed close to the pole, and driven by striking it with a weight, on substantially the same principle as in the ordinary method. The conductor being driven, the tools and temper screws are attached to a cable, which is run over a pulley in the top of the pole, and down the other side, where it is attached to a pitman which works in a slot, thus giving the tools two drops for every revolution of the pole. The drop is, of course, independent, and consequently much more effective than a drop made by the slow motion of a walking beam. The tools are turned with the machine, and no reamer is needed. The tools are raised, the sand pumping and the pumping for testing the well, are done by the aid of horse power.

The average number of feet drilled per day by the machine, in limestone formation, was six, but in the softer formation in the oil region it is expected that it will be much greater.

Is Animal Food Always Injurious. It seems to me perfectly unreasonable that God, in blessing Noah after the flood for his faithfulness, should give him control of every beast of the earth, and every fowl of the air, and all that moveth upon the earth, and the fishes of the sea, and should tell him that "every moving thing that liveth shall be given for you, even as the green herb;" and should cause to be deposited in all these living creatures the same elements, in the same combinations as are wanted in the human system, and as are found in the "green herb," or vegetable food, and should, at the same time, make one class to be appropriate food and the other injurious.

That each class of food does contain the same elements, in the same combinations, and nearly the same proportions, is seen by tables of analysis. Take two articles—beef and wheat, for example. Beef contains of carbonaceous food thirty per cent., nitrogenous sixteen, phosphoric five, and water fifty. Wheat contains of carbonaceous food seventy per cent., nitrogenous five, phosphoric two, and water fourteen. Now, considering that thirty per cent of fat is equal to two and a half times as much starch, in heating power, or seventy-five to that of wheat at seventy; these two articles, and beef being of average fatness, in strengthening and heating qualities are nearly alike; but the beef has more than twice the nerve and brain food that the wheat has.

In this last respect, however, beef and wheat differ from each other than some other articles; entirely vegetable. For example, Northern corn contains but one per cent of nerve and brain food, while beans contain three and a half per cent., and Southern corn, four. From "How Not to be Sick," by A. J. Bellows, M.
