TUESDAY, July 27, 1869. For years past Pittsburgh has drawn liberally on the west for Flour and Grain, but the way matters now stand it looks as if we will have to get supplies nearer home. All kinds of Grain and Flour, too, are now relatively higher in the western markets than here, so that the margin is the wrong way to dealers buying there for this market, and as a consequence, the receipts from Chicago and Milwaukee have been remarkably light for some weeks past, and unless there is a change soon, one way or the other, they will have to cease altogether. To illustrate, No. 1 Spring Wheat was was quoted there on Monday, at \$1,38@ 1,40, while prime old Red Winter, is selling here at \$1,40, and heretofore the latling here at \$1,40, and heretofore the lat-ter has always been considered worth more than the latter. Choice Spring Wheat flours were quoted there yester-day at \$7,00@7,25, while good Winter Wheat brands are being sold here at about the same figures, and it is gener-ally conceded that the latter is a better article than theformer, and until recent-ly has brought from 25@50 cts per bbl more. This is operating badly on dealers as the majority of them are almost out of stock, and what is worse still, they can-not replace at present figures. Our mills, however, have reason to be satis-with the situation, as they can now suc-cessfully compete with western floures, and, for the time being, have the advan-tage over dealers.

The Provision market is considerably firmer under the influence of the advices from Cincinnati and Chicago, and prices, are steadily advancing. In Groceries there is nothing specially new or impor-tant, with the exception that there is a continued brisk demand for Raw Sugars.
