BEANS—Sales at \$4.75 per bush. BROOMS—Quoted as follows: No. 5 \$3.50, No. 4 \$3.00, No. 3 \$2.50.

WHEAT—The market continues firm, though devoid of excitement, and notwithstanding stocks are pretty well cleared, buyers take very sparingly.

GRAIN—Wheat is in steady milling demand and in limited supply; we continue to quote prime old Red at \$1.10.
