As the season for sowing is near at hand the suggestions offered in an article contributed to the Patent Office Report for 1854, by E. Weston, of Bloomfield, Maine, may be of value to some of our readers:

"To our flour mills may be seen the caps of the root sprout, blown out by the blower or fan, under the hopper, by quarts at above. One farmer told me he had tried sown with another barrel threshed with a machine, and the difference was at least one quarter. Thus it is seen that one quarter of the seed is killed by the machine for threshing; and the whole is run through an ordinary fanning mill all together, and sown from the mass. We raise our wheat, year after year, from about three-fourths of the seed sown, and fullest being killed.
