Mail Robber Arrested

Col. Arthur Hughes, Special Agent of Reading on Thursday morning last, a man named Adam H. Smith, recently a clerk in the Post Office at Richmond, Northampton county, on the charge of robbing the mails. The prisoner, on being taken into custody, confessed to taking one letter, containing \$400, mailed at Stroudsburg, for the Easton Bank. He had purchased with this money a horse and wagon, and had been on a pleasure excursion to Harrisburg, Carlisle, &c., with a female companion whom he had persuaded to run off with him from Plainfield, near Richmond. The horse, which was still in his possession, and is valued at \$175, he gave into the charge of Col. Hughes. He had disposed of the wagon but a few hours previous to his arrest. Several letters had been missed for some time from the Post Office at Richmond, where Smith had charge of the mails temporarily, and a couple of weeks since suspicion had rested on him, from his having in possession several \$100 bills.
