A Uniform Currency.

It is stated that an interesting report has been received by the Treasury Department from Professor Alexander, of Baltimore, who is now in England, engaged in securing a uniform currency for the two countries, as authorized by the last Congress. He says the decimal currency will be easily agreed upon by the commissioners. It will be recollected that the act of Congress requires that there be no departure from the decimal system. Additional instructions will be forwarded to Prof. A. in a few days.


