Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual military service, under a requisition from the President of the Uhited States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at
