

Postal Affairs.
The Government in now drawing on all Southern Postmasters for balances due prior to the Rebellion. Drafts have been drawn on all the Presidential offices in the Southern States, amounting to \$157,407 18. Virginia is further behind than any other State, her indebtedness amounting to \$29,190 80. In each case the delinquent postmaster has been notified that unless the drafts are paid, suits will immediately be commenced against them by the Department.

The Money-Order Office, established November 1, 1864, had issued at the close of the fiscal year, ending June 30, 1865 over 74,000 money-orders, amounting to \$1,360,122 52. The amount of fees received was \$11,534 90, of which sum postmasters received one-third, and the Government the remainder. During the eight months referred to there were 143 offices in operation, at an aggregate expense during that period of \$28,684 27. There are now 420 offices in operation.

The grand firemen's parade in Philadelphia on Monday last, was an imposing demonstration. There were in the procession 102 hose carriages, 57 steamers, 11 hand engines, 12 hook and ladder carriages, and 21 ambulances, including 30 companies from abroad. It is estimated that the line was ten miles in length. The day was fine, and the citizens turned out on mass to do honor to the fireman.

Jeff. Davis' treasure has been counted at the Treasury Department, and found to amount to \$100,000—\$87,878 being in gold and \$8,882 in silver.

The amount of gold now in existence is estimated at four thousand eight hundred and sixty two millions; of silver, five thousand seven hundred millions.
