The merchant, in whose hands it chances to be, thoughtlessly of course, (for merchants are always houest,) passes it to the trader, and he, seeing that it does not look quite right, but not thinking it worth while to scrutinize it too closely, passes it to the grocer, and he, glancing at it and not liking the looks of it exactly, but not wishing to be over particular and saying, "I took it and must get rid of it," passes it to the market man ; and he, saying "it might as well be kept travelling," passes it, as he journeying is to the conductor; and he, knowning that it is not good, but disliking to say anything to the man, says to himself, "I will keep it, and give it to Pa. somebody else," and passes it to the sewing woman. She is poor, and a person that is poor is always watched, and when she offers it, is discovered to be spurious and is refused; and she looks at it and says : "It is nearly my whole day's wages; but it is counterfeit, and of course I must not pass it ;" and she burns it up, and so is the only honorable one among them all. 


