How to Preserve Furs. As the season has arrived when it becomes necessary to lay furs aside and preserve them from their ravishers, the meths, following hints may be useful to our lady readers: One ounce of gum camphor and one ounce of powdered shell of red pepper are macerated in eight ounces strong alchol for seven days and then strained. With this tineture the furs and clothes are sprinkled over and rolled up in sheets. This remedy is in constant use in Russia, under the name of "Chinese Tincture for Moths," and is found very effective.
