An easy way to preserve eggs is to rub the outside of the shell as soon as it is gathered from the nest, with a little butter or any other grease that is not fetid By filling up the pores of the shell, the evaporation of the liquid part of the eggs is prevented, and by this means excludes the external air. The milkiness which most people are fond of in new laid eggs, will be preserved for months, as perfect as when taken from the nest.
