

German-English Normal Institute!
Brodheads ville, Monroe Co., Pa.
Rev. D. E. Schœdler, A. M., Principal.

SPRING TERM, 1871.

The first session of this institution will commence in the Public School House at Brodheads-ville, on the first Tuesday in April, 1871, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, and continue 10 weeks.

CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION.
Any person of good moral character will be admitted as a student.
Students are admitted at any time during the term, but it is earnestly desired that they enter at the beginning of the term.

COURSES OF INSTRUCTION.
ELEMENTARY COURSE.
This course embraces all the branches that are required by Law to be taught in the Common Schools of Pennsylvania.

HIGHER COURSE.
This course embraces such branches as are not usually taught in the Common Schools of our State.

NORMAL COURSE.
This course constitutes the main feature of the Institution. It embraces
1st. Instruction in all the branches which Common school teachers are usually obliged to teach.
2d. Theoretical and practical instruction in Methods of Instruction. A course of Lectures will be delivered on the Science of Education and the Art of Teaching, with special reference to prevailing German School Districts. The German Language will be taught, theoretically and practically, without any extra charge. Students who desire to pursue only a partial course, may select such branches as they may deem most advantageous.

LOCATION.
Brodheads-ville, where the building of the WICKERSHAM GERMAN-ENGLISH NORMAL SCHOOL will be erected, is a rural village, surrounded by a country of surpassing beauty. The wood-crowned hills, and fertile valleys watered by beautiful streams and dotted with fresh-water lakes, render a landscape ever new and ever pleasing. This, in connection with healthfulness of the locality—consumption and epidemics are almost unknown here—makes it pre-eminently a place for a NORMAL SCHOOL. Moreover, the people are honest, sober, and industrious, and the religious facilities are all that can be desired.

MEANS OF ACCESS.
Persons from a distance desiring to reach the school can do so per stage from Stroudsburg, on the Delaware, Lackawanna, and Western Railroad, on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday of each week; from Lehighton, on the Lehigh Valley Railroad, and Weissport, on the Lehigh and Susquehanna Railroad, on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday of each week; also from Hickory Run, and other points.
