Fall Plowing.

There is no more important work on the farm than fall preparation of the soil for the spring crops.

The farmer receives many advantages from the performance of this important fall work, and there is no work which will pay better to be well done.

Each furrow slice should be turned up of a uniform width and depth.

The ground is usually dry in the fall, as it does always be when plowed.

Plowing should be done before the seeds ripen on noxious weeds.

If the advice of Mr. Greeley, to "plow deep" is followed, be sure it is done in the fall, that the new soil may be percolated by the fertilizing influences of the rain and atmosphere containing the gases, etc.
