How to make Boys good Farmers.

Induce them to take an interest in the farm; in the implements; in the stock tell them all your plans, your successes and failures; give them a history of life, and what you did and how you lived when a boy; but do not harp too much on the degenerate character of the young men of the present age; praise them when you can, and encourage them to do still better. Let them dress up for the evening, instead of sitting down in their dirty clothes in a dingy room. Provide plenty of light; thanks in kerosene, our country homes can be as brilliantly and as cheaply lighted as the gaslit houses in the city. Encourage the neighbors to drop in evenings. Talk agriculture rather than politics; speak more the importance of large crops, of good stock, of liberal feeding, and of the advantages of making animals comfortable, rather than of the hard times, low prices and high wages. Above all; encourage the boys to read good agricultural books .l'apers are all well enough, but an intel ligent boy wants something more and bet ter. Get him some good agricultural books to study. Read it with him, and give him the benefit of your experience and criticism. When he has mastered this, buy him another. In our own case, we own our love of farming principally to the fact that our father talked to us of everything that was doing on the farm; auswering all our questions, and encourag ing, rather than refusing our childhke desire of helping him.

Fatting Hogs.

If a farmer happens to be without straw for one winter he fully realizes the value of it in his business. A good straw stack makes a cheerful barn yard in the winter You will rarely see poor stock where there is a large stack of bright straw.
