Borough Ordinance.

Be it ordained by the Chief Burgess and Town Council, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same. First—That all Physicians practicing in the Borough of Stroudsburg, shall report to the Chief Burgess all cases of small pox or varioloid, occurring within the Borough of Stroudsburg, within six hours after becoming cognizant thereof, under a penalty of fifty dollars, for failure thereof. The name and residence of the infected person, to be labelled at the office of the Chief Burgess. Second—That the head of any family in which there shall be a case of small pox or varioloid, who shall voluntarily permit the entrance into the infected house of any person, except members of the family, Physician or nurse, or who shall voluntarily permit any intercourse between members of his family and others, except the Physician and nurse, shall be subjected to a fine of fifty dollars.
