Lime for Fruit Trees.

The Horticulturalist says it is a good plan for all fruit growers to apply lime freely in their orchard every two or three years. A half bushel to each tree, or 100 bushels broadcast, per acre, will suffice Light loamy lands will be best benefitted by the lime and shell lime is better for fruit trees than the usual stone lime.
