

**Lime for Fruit Trees.**  
The Horticulturalist says it is a good plan for all fruit growers to apply lime freely to their orchard every two or three years. A half bushel to each tree, or 100 bushels broadcast, per acre, will suffice. Light loamy lands will be best benefited by the lime and shell lime is better for fruit trees than the usual stone lime.

The name and residence of the infected person, to be bulletined at the office of the Chief Burgess.  
Second.—That the head of any family in which there shall be a case of small pox or varioloid, who shall voluntarily permit the entrance into the infected house of any person, except members of the family, Physician or nurse, or who shall voluntarily permit any intercourse between members of his family and others, except the Physician and nurse, shall be subjected to a fine of fifty dollars.
