

Profane Swearing.

We publish below the law of this State which prohibits profanity. The statute was almost forgotten until a man was lately prosecuted in Lancaster for using blasphemous language. The fellow was fined for two oaths at sixty-seven cents each, which was getting off at a very cheap rate.

Whoever shall willfully, premeditatedly and despitely blasphemous or speak loosely and profanely of Almighty God, (Christ Jesus the Holy Spirit, or the Scriptures of Truth, and) is legally convicted thereof, shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten pounds, for the use of the poor of the county where such offense shall be committed, or suffer three months imprisonment at hard labor, for the use of the poor.

If any person of the age of sixteen years or upwards, shall profanely curse or swear by the name of God, Christ Jesus, or the Holy Ghost, every person so offending, being thereof convicted, shall forfeit and pay the sum of sixty-seven cents for every such profane curse or oath; and in case she shall refuse or neglect to pay the said forfeiture, or goods and chattels cannot be found whereof to levy the same by distress, he or she shall be committed to the house of correction of the proper county, not exceeding twenty-four hours, for every such offense of which such person shall be convicted; and whosoever of the age of sixteen years or upwards shall curse or swear by any other name or thing than as aforesaid and shall be convicted thereof, shall forfeit and pay the sum of forty cents for every such curse or oath; and in case such offender, shall neglect or refuse to satisfy such forfeiture, or no goods or chattels can be found, whereof to levy the same by distress, he or she shall be committed to the house of correction of the proper county, not exceeding twelve hours, for every such offense.

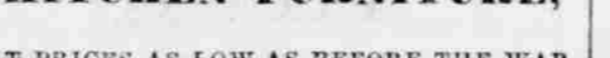
