### Beans as a Field Crop.

A number of correspondents have ask ed for information relating to the cultiva tion of beans as a field crop, or for seed, including soil adapted to the crop. varieties, time of planting, etc. We shall treat briefly, from this standpoint; since dry the difference in cultivation will be to be in pulling, the planting and cultiva tion being exceedingly simple; but the cheap as the parent. danger of loss through rainy weather, at harvest time, is often another difficulty to the grower.

Beans for field culture should be sown to one and a half bushels per acre. Sow in the spring, on dry, mellow soil, about opening and bring your stamps with you.

A double shovel plow is one of the best implements to cultivate with during the early growth. Just before, or about the time of blossoming, finish with the single shovel, leaving the furrow in the middle between the rows. When thorough ly ripe, pull them, keeping them grasped in the hand, next the root, until you have a handful. Set them on the tops, in wind or his business A SPECIALITY. rows, squeezing the root together, and

accomplished, it saves the expense of future hand picking. Many persons stack them thinly around rough poles, the shortest possible notice. [Sept. 26,'67, with spurs projecting to keep them off the ground. Place the roots next the A. H. FRANCISCUS & CO. poles, with the tops slanting downward as much as possible. Fasten, and cap the top with slough hay, to keep off the rain; and when thoroughly dry, remove to the barn, and mow them away; or, if threshed immediately, spread thinly and turn occasionally, until entirely hard and dry. If packed in barrels or sacks before they are thoroughly seasoned, they will be liable to mold or become discolored.

The cultivation of beans may also in clude the sort usually grown for market ing green, or as they are termed, string of Goods. beans The cultivation of these varieties is exactly like that of the white sorts, and CELEBRATED AMERICAN WASHER, the curing is precisely the same; pole beans, however, are planted in hills three and one half feet apart, and supported Washer in all parts of the State. [Sep. 5-3m. with proper poles. In this case labor is necessary, since it is difficult to get through them with a horse. The sorts usually grown for bush string beans are Red eyed China, Valentine, Long Yellow Six Weeks, Round Yellow Six Weeks and Early Rachel. Good varieties of pole beans are Case Knife, Indian Chief, Saber or Cimeter and White Cranberry. The list of varieties of garden beans cultiva tion is large, and includes Dalichos, or asparagus beans, and Phaseolus, or Lima beans, Scarlet runners, etc. The White Navy bean is the sort usually grown f r shipment, but the White Marrow is superior for family use; but beans are at best a crop subject to many risks .-Western Rural.


