MOLES.

Lead Pencils.

In the manufacture of lead pencils, the Florida red cedar is mostly used in this country and in Europe; some "iben" wood, as the Germans call it, or English yew, is used in Germany; white pine is occasionally used for a common grade of carpenter's pencil.

In mixing the clay and graphite, great care is taken in selecting and cleaning the clay and getting the proper proportions; the mixture, with water, after being well kneaded, is placed in a large receiver and strongly compressed and forced out through a small groove at the bottom, in the shape of a thread of the thickness and style required, either square, octagon or round.

The Wood, after being thoroughly seasoned, is cut into thin strips and dried again; then cut into strips pencil length. These strips are grooved by machinery, then carried on a belt to the gluing room, where the lead is glued in the groove, and then the other half of the pencil glued on.

The stamping is done by a hollow die, which is heated; the gold or silver foil is then laid on the pencil, which rests in an iron bed, and the die is then pressed on it by a screw lever. The pencils are then ready to go to the packing room.
