It is not the increase of the breadstuffs exports that we would now turn our attention to, for in that line Russia, Ger many, and the Mediterranean countries are our formidable rivals. But we should build iron works all over the Northwest: turn wheat into iron, and instead of ship ping pigs of pork ship pigs of iron. See what this industry has already done for the West. The census of 1870 shows the product of manufactures in these states thus; Ohio \$269,713,610; Indiana, \$108,617.278; Illinois, \$205,620,672; dec. 14, '71-tf.]. Missouri, \$202,212,429; Michigan, \$118, 394,976; Wisconsin, 877,241,326. And all this rests upon the remarkable growth and prosperity of the Western iron manu facture, as is seen in the fact that the largest increase is in the iron districts .-North America.
