HEARTRENDING SCENES AND INCIDENTS

WILLIAMSPORT, Dec 26 - Last even ing the Sabbath school of the Baptist Church at Newberry, in the Seventh Ward of this city, assembled to partici pute in the ceremonies of Christmas night Some three hundred men, women and children were there congregated. 
