

The Lehigh Valley Railroad announces a quarterly dividend of 2 1/2 per cent., payable April 15th.

A bill amend the Local Option law of last year has been favorably reported in the State Legislature. It provides that domestic wines, cider and malt liquors shall not be included in its operations—The only immediate effect of the bill would be upon the election in Philadelphia next October.

The largest number of dismissals ever made by a President at one time, will be on the 20th of May next, when sixteen hundred Assessors and Assistant Assessors of the Internal Revenue will be discharged. The Bureau employs two hundred and forty five clerks and messengers at headquarters.

Philadelphia had in the year 1872 112,000 houses—3000 more than New York and Brooklyn combined. The population averaged about six persons to each house, while in New York the average is nearly fifteen. It is very well for New Yorkers to speak of Philadelphia as a provincial town, but the figures show that she is considerable of a place.

A Sequel to the Hem about Glass Stockings.

A glass composition, which may be made at any time into curled or frizzled yarn, has been discovered by M Brunant, of Vienna. These frizzled threads surpass in fineness not only the finest cotton, but even a single cocoon thread, and they appear at the same time almost as soft and elastic as silk lint, and beautiful to the eye. These smooth threads are now worn in textile fabrics, which are made into neckties and various other articles. In softness the glass yarn almost approaches silk; and to the touch it is like the choicest wool or cotton. It also possesses a remarkable strength, remains unchanged in light and warmth, and is altered by moisture or acids. Another great advantage which it necessarily possesses, is that of being non-inflammable and incalculable. The composition of this glass material is peculiar to the inventor. The spinning requires extraordinary dexterity and constant attention, and is said to be very trying to the sight. With a wheel of the diameter of five Austrian yards, one operative is able to spin three thousand yards per minute, all of the most uniform size and beautiful quality.
