On the 22d of March the Emperor William of Germany completed his 76th birthday and it was duly celebrated in Berlin. His life has been a singular, long and eventful one. Born in 1797. he is old enough to remember the utter ruin inflicted upon Prussia by Napoleon the First in 1806 and 1807, when she was cut from 9,000,000 people to 5,000,-000, and half her territory wrested from her, and when she was bound by treaty not to keep up an army of over 60,000 men. There is some difference between Dec. 5.'72-tf.] that Prussia and the one he rules over to day, with its 40,000,000 of people and an army of over a million of men. He has been in Paris with a Prussian army twice. He has seen three generations of European monarchs. The future historian will re gard his reign as more important in the annuls of Prussia than that of any of its previous rulers, with, perhaps, that of Frederick the Great alone excepted Although a man of no superior ability, he has had the next best thing to it, the faculty of recognizing it in others, and selecting them as counselors in his cab inet and as leaders of his armies.
