

Second -He shall have resided in the State one year. (or if, having previously been a qualified elector or native born citizen of the State, he shall have removed therefrom and returned, then six months,) immediately preceding the election. Third-He shall have resided in the election district where he shall offer to vote at least two months immediately preceding the election. Fourth-If twenty-two years of age or upwards, he shall have paid within two years a state or county tax, which shall have been assessed at

least two months and paid at least one month before the election."
