In parsing, the relative pronoun "what, Prof. differs from most grammarians. The relative what has a double construction and is sometimes the object of two different verbs, and is sometimes the object of one verb and the subject of another.

In parsing the word "mine," we should say it has the possessive form and may be either subject or object.




