CHARTER PERPETUAL.

The By-Laws of this Company, and regulations governing insurance, have recently been very materially changed, placing it upon a basis equal to that of any Life Insurance Company in the State.

Important among these changes are the following: 1st. Policies, instead of being perpetual, are issued for five years.

2nd. All property is described and the rate of premium is fixed according to the risk of the property.

3rd. Premium notes are taken, and all assessments are made on the notes.

4th. Property is insured for not more than two thirds of its actual cash value, and the full amount of insurance paid in case of loss, provided the loss be equal to the amount of insurance.

5th. Annual assessments only are made, except in cases of heavy loss, and where a special assessment is necessary.

6th. The Company is therefore prepared to insure property upon terms much more desirable than under the old system.

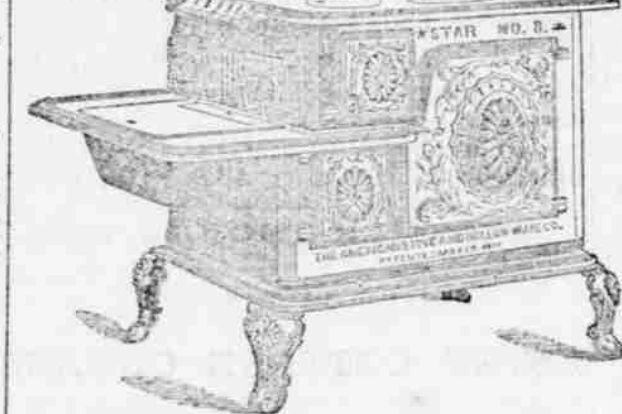
