That the following streets and parts of streets be curbed and paved with good hard Brick or Flag Stone, to wit:

The North side of Ann Street between Franklin and Centre Streets, seven feet wide.

The East side of Analomink Avenue from the north line of William H. Garis' lot to Main Street, four feet wide.

The West side of George Street, between Monroe and Sarah Streets, seven feet wide.

Both sides of Monroe Street between Centre and Franklin Streets, and the South side between Franklin and the Mill Race, seven feet wide.
