A party of 400 strong will leave Chicago on March 15 for the Black Hills. The expedition has been formed by James Conklin, who accompanied Professor Jenney last season. The secretary of the company has received 2,300 letters of inquiry since the announcement of its organization special train, and arrangements have been completed with the railroads to transport latest stytes in the men from Chicago to the Hills for \$26 apiece.

A letter from Milwaukee says that a prosperous storekeeper intends leaving his business and leading a party, who will start on April 2, going via Cheyenne. The main company consists of men in the following professions: Two physicians, one veterinary surgeon, one druggist, two assayers, twenty carpenters, three blacksmiths, several grocers, a number of farmers, one clothier, a dry goods dealer, a coal dealer, together with intelligent, industrious laborers, and half a dozen old miners who have been in Nevada, Arizona, Colorado and California, and who feel they are Forty-niners again. The entire party will probably embrace not fewer than from 300 to 400 men. One gentleman will take a sawmill. Another proposes to trasport a shingle mill to the land of golden sand.

Messrs. Stubbs and Thompson have returned to Laramie from the hills, and report lively times at Custer City. Just before they left a wedding took place at Custer City-the first to occur in that region. September 3, 1874.-tf. The parties were William Hardesty and Miss Ida Simms, both late of Cheyenne. Messrs. Stubbs and Thompson also report G. H. Dreher. that the first steam whistle ever sounded in that section was heard on February 6. It was a saw-mill whistle.

A. L. Jones of Golden, now in Custer City, writes a letter from which we extract as follows: "I have been prospecting every (2 doors west of the "Jeffersonian Office,") ifornia, the devastation following in the track day and have found some gold, but as yet nothing that will pay. The snow has been very deep and everything is frozen up. There seems to be gold all over the country, but not in paying quantities. About forty miles from here are some good diggings, we hear. At this place the bed rock is from eighteen to twenty-five feet, and no gold till you reach bed rock, and then it is not very plenty. I have found some about four feet from the surface, but not in paying quantities. After I try the Deadwood and Drywood diggings, if I find them no better than these, I will be ready to leave this country."

A party of twenty, mostly coal miners, will start from Medicine Bow, on the Union Pacific, next Monday for the gold fields. They will take route or trail rather, through Sabille Canyon, which is reported to be free Hard RUBBER TRUSSES-Also of snow.

Jules Ecoffey, a Wyoming pioneer, thinks Custer City will be the commerical and Hillyo the mining town of the Hills, their relations to each other being about the same as Denver and Central City.

Judge Knydendall writes an interesting letter from Custer City to the Chevenne Leader. He says, among other things that only a few claims are now being worked at that place. Quartz indications are good all over the country. Rich discoveries are reported on Deadwood and Whitewood creeks, seventy miles north of Custer City In some localities the bed rock is near the surface : in others it is very deep. Washed gravel, black sand and rubies, white and variegated, abound. One hundred and fifty houses will be completed in Custer City by March 1. Some of the buildings are substantial structures. Hill City al ready numbers fifty cabins and 100 inhabitants. The judge says he is satisfied with the country and intends to star there. the country and intends to stay there.


