It is the advantage of fered to us as farmers and citizens to sustain the honor of the state in peacefu rivalry with the great industries of the world. Our endeavor should be to excel them all.

It is impossible, in a circular, to go over taken such action as it was thought becoming it should take on behalf of the interests of the National Exposition in ommitting its own exhibition for 1876, and by the offer of a large sum to such objects of merit as may deserve reward. 
