THE WILKESBARRE WICKEDNESS.

More Corruption to be Disclosed Official Quaking.

WILKESBARRE, Pa., April 19.—The work of unscrupulous official fraud and corruption in Luzerne county is to be prosecuted with unrelenting vigor.

The work will now be done thoroughly, and it is anticipated that the results will prove astonishing.

It is alleged that for years past the officers in the court house have been exacting illegal fees, and this fact, together with many others connected with the general working of the infamous Wilkesbarre ring, will be laid bare to the public.

As an illustration of how matters have been carried on in Luzerne county, it may be mentioned that at the present term of court Prothonotary S. W. Triimmer and his chief clerk are to stand trial upon a charge of forging and altering election returns.

There is talk that other warrants are in preparation for prominent members of the ring who have been robbing the county, and there is considerable fluttering in and around the court house.

The evidence taken by the auditors indicates that the late Commissioners had but indifferent legal advice in their transactions, for some of the witnesses say that the counsel of the old board, who acts in a like capacity to the present one, demanded a percentage on contracts made for the county, upon a plea that he had to divide with his employers.
