CHARTER PERPETUAL.

The By-Laws of this Company, and regulations concern-ing Insurance have, recently been very carefully changed, placing it upon a basis equal to that of any Fire Insurance Company in the State.

Important among these changes are the following:

1. Policies, instead of being perpetual, are now for five years.

2. All property is classified, and the rate of premium is fixed according to the risk of the property.

3. Premium notes are issued, and all assessments are made on the notes.

4. Property is insured for not more than two thirds of its actual cash value, and the full amount of loss is paid in case of loss, provided the loss be equal to the amount of insurance.

5. Annual assessments only are made, except in case of heavy loss, and where a special assessment is necessary.

6. The Company is therefore prepared to insure property upon terms which insure the insured against the risk of loss.
