The Turkish Insurrection.

REPULSE OF THE TURKS IN MONTENEGRO - OTHMAN PASHA TAKEN PRISONER. St. Petersburg, July 29.—The Golos publishes a special dispatch from Risano, a village of Dalmatia, seven miles northwest of Cattaro, which says: "Moukhtar Pasha, on the 25th inst., succeeded, without attention of the enemy, in outflanking Prince Nikkita's army near Korito. Moukhtar Pasha has reached Blek. Prince Nikkita's position is critical."

The Golos also publishes a special dispatch from Cetinje, stating that a telegram received from Prince Nikkita, dated Grhova, July 28, says: "The Turks under Moukhtar Pasha attacked us early to-day near Urbiza. A severe engagement ensued, and the fighting is still proceeding. We have broken through the Turkish lines. Othman Pasha was captured and brought here alive, and we have taken many prisoners."

Turkish Atrocities in Bosnia.

PARIS, July 31.—The Courier's special telegrams give the details of massacres by the Turks in Bosnia. Three hundred Christians were tortured and drowned in the villages of Perwan and Trimar. Twelve women were cut to pieces at Pavics. Sixty children were stoned to death at Rathlovo. One hundred and eighty girls were violated and murdered at Sokolovo.

The Black Flag Raised Against Christians.

LONDON, July 30.—The Standard's special dispatch from Kalafit says the Turkish army crossed the Serbian frontier at Nissa on Saturday. A great battle is expected. There is great excitement at the seat of war among the Christians on account of a proclamation by Derwish Pasha, the Turkish commander in Bosnia, prohibiting quarter to Christians. The Standard's Yagusa special says Selim Pasha has been killed. Three thousand Christians were massacred at Pryedor.

Act to Suppress Lotteries.

Both Houses of Congress recently passed, and the President has signed, an act which will have the effect, if carried out, of entirely suppressing the lottery business in the United States, or even the circulation of lottery tickets or gift concert advertisements. The first section relates to the circulation through the mails of obscene literature, and is a slight amendment of the present law. The second section amends section 3,893 of the postal laws, so that it will read as follows:

No letter or circular concerning lotteries, so-called gift concerts, or other similar enterprises offering prizes, or concerning schemes devised and intended to deceive and defraud the public for the purpose of obtaining money under false pretenses, shall be carried in the mail. Any person who shall knowingly deposit anything to be carried by mail in violation of this section, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 nor less than \$100, with cost of prosecution.

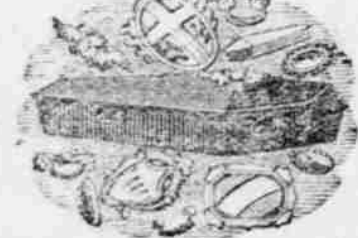
