Thirdly, to prepare young men for Colleges and Universities.

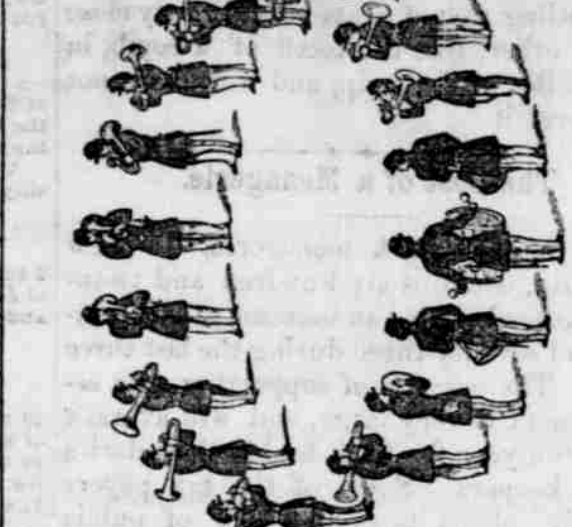
No efforts will be spared to make our school-room the most attractive in the county. Our work must commend us.
