GREEN CORN PUDDING .- This is one of the numerous rural luxuries which the farmer has always the power to obtain at small expense. The following is the recipe for making it :--

Take of green corn ,full in the milk, twelve ears, and grate it. To this add one quart of sweet milk, one-fourth of a pound of fresh butter, four eggs, well heaten, pepper and salt as much as may be deemed necessary : stir the ingredients well together, and bake in a buttered dish. Some add to the other ingredients a quarter of a pound of fine sugar, and eat with sauce. It is an excellent dish, cold or warm, with meat or sauce ; but epicures of the most "equisite taste" declare for it, we believe, and with the first service.

NOT ASHAMED OF THEIR TRADES -- A singular exchange of courtesies took place a short time since, between Judge Pepper of the 7th Judicial District of Tennessee, and be dealt with according to the act of Assembly in Governor Johnson of the same State.
