THE ATLANTIC TELEGRAPH SUCCESSFULLY LAID.

The Atlantic Telegraph... The Old World and the New Telegraphically United.

St. John's, N. F., August 5.—The United States steamer Niagara arrived at Trinity Bay yesterday with the great news of the success of the Atlantic Telegraph enterprise.

The cable has been successfully laid, and the Western end of the cable will be landed to-day. The signals have been perfectly transmitted throughout the voyage.

The following dispatch has been received from Cyrus W. Field, Esq., of the Atlantic Telegraph Company:

Trinity Bay, August 5th, 1858. To the Agents of the Associated Press: The Atlantic Telegraph fleet sailed from Queenstown on Saturday, July 17th, and met in mid-ocean on the 25th.

It is 1,600 nautical or 1,950 statute miles from the telegraph house at the head of Valencia harbor to the telegraph house at Bay Bulls, Trinity Bay, and for more than two-thirds of this distance the water is over two miles in depth.

The machinery for laying out the cable worked most satisfactorily, and it was not stopped a single moment.

After the end of the cable has been landed and connected with the land line of telegraph, the Niagara has discharged some cargo belonging to the Telegraph Company, who will go to St. John's for coals, and then proceed at once to New York.

Trinity Bay, (N. F.), Aug. 7, 1858. The complete success of the Atlantic cable placed beyond all doubt.

To the Associated Press, New York.—The Atlantic Telegraph cable was successfully landed here yesterday morning, and is in perfect order.

Mr. Field's Reply to the President Relative to the Expected Message from the Queen. Bedford Springs, Aug. 8.—The President received the following despatch from Cyrus W. Field, Esq., in reply to his intimation that he had not yet received the Queen's message:

Trinity Bay, Aug. 7.—To His Excellency, James Buchanan, President of the U. S. Bedford Springs.—Your telegraphic despatch has been received. We landed here a wilderness, and until the telegraph instruments are landed here, no message can be recorded over the cable.

The end of the Atlantic cable was landed on the Irish shore from the Niagara on the 5th of August, 1857, and the other end from the same vessel on the 5th of August, 1858.

THE TELEGRAPH BOAT SAILED FROM PLYMOUTH on the experimental trip on the 29th of May. The cable was broken at the stern of the Agamemnon on the first attempt to lay it, on the 29th of June and the splice in mid-ocean on the last and successful attempt on the 29th of July.
