The Union Convention, held in pursuance to a call, met in the Court House at Sunbury, on the 9th day of September, 1861.

Resolved, That we will stand by our constitutional government, and our legally elected President, in this conflict with treason and rebellion, to the last extremity and at all hazards. Resolved, That the speediest and cheapest way to put an end to the war, to repress this lawless rebellion, and to restore the Union, is for the government to exert its fullest power, and for the people to stand united in support of the government, contributing with cheerfulness and zeal the necessary aid in money and in kind.
