Press one bunch of the common wild grapes; take the juice off and mix the residue with a solution of 6 pounds white sugar in 3 gallons of water, by well stirring up, and let stand over night. Then press again, and treat the residue with four and a half pounds of sugar in 3 gallons of water, in the same way as before, and this operation you may repeat once more. The original juice of the grapes should then be mixed with the other liquids obtained by pressing, and the whole allowed to undergo the alcoholic or vicious fermentation, which operation will be finished in from three to seven days, according to the outside temperature, which notwithstanding, should never surpass 27 degrees Reamur. After this process—that is after the transformation of most of the sugar into alcohol, and after the formation of carbonic acid is ceasing—the wine is ready for use. By filling the liquids into a barrel or for fermentation, according to the quantity, take the precaution to see that the vessel, whence opening must be as small as possible, to keep most of the oxygen of the air off, be nearly full with the liquids, and if not so, fill it so far with a solution of 1 pound white sugar in 1 quart of water. This wine is of a beautiful ruby color, a very agreeable, not too acid, and slightly astringent taste, and contains between 7 and 8 per cent. alcohol. If you want to give it more flavor, add the scented rhine-wine, balsom, or any kind of Confectionary, Fruit, Toys, &c., all of which are to be had at Sunbury.

THE HOUSEKEEPER.

MUCH CAKES.—Mush Cakes presupposes you have had for supper the night before a tureen of good mush, made by stirring Indian meal into boiling water slowly, and boiling it thereafter well for three hours. In the morning for breakfast, with say two quarts of the mush left over, stir in for a family of six, 3 cups flour, three pints of warm milk; beat well two eggs and add, with half teaspoonful of soda; then with a dash of wheat flour in your fingers add the batter to make the cake adhere, sift all well and bake in cakes upon a flat griddle, and send to table in parties of six.

There is nothing that will resuscitate old gardens so quickly and lastingly as lime, applied at the rate of not less than a hundred bushels to the acre. It should not be dug in, but spread over the soil after digging and raking.

In white-washing grape arbites and grape houses, mix with the whitewash flour of sulphur in quality so as not to effect the color. There is nothing better to drive away insects.
