**Antiquarian Discoveries in Peru—
Rich Gold Mines.**

The San Francisco *Bulletin* publishes the following interesting account of recent antiquarian discoveries in Peru:

"From Captain Morehouse, who arrived at this port from Tumbes, Peru, a few days since, we learn that extensive discoveries have been made there of the ruins of a temple of ancient Peru. On the Corralis river, about four miles from Cumbez, a continuation of a spur of the mountain range has long been supposed to cover the ruins of an ancient temple, popular tradition asserting that one had existed at that place on a high mound, which mound was excavated under the foundations of the temple. When the Spaniards under Pizarro took the adjacent town, the wooden supports underneath were set on fire and were consumed, when the whole ruined temple fell in a mass of indistinguishable ruins."

"Some years ago a French antiquary traveled in Peru, losing of these traditions, made an examination of the locality, after which he went to France. About eighteen months since, this person having procured means returned to Peru and obtained from that government permission to excavate and search near the Corralis river for antiquarian purposes, the searcher to be protected by government, and to take for his own uses whatever of such antiquarian character as might be found. An excavation or tunnel was made in this supposed mound, and after months of labor the exploring party was rewarded for his efforts by finding the remains of a very large building, the wall of which had been built of adobes, inside of which a great many articles of gold and silver work were found, many being small golden images unknown implements, and articles of ornament. The natives employed were thieves, and more being stolen than was received, the Frenchman discharged his laborers and had the tunnel closed up while he went to Lima to get workmen in whose honesty he could confide. Matters were in this state when Captain Morehouse sailed for San Francisco."

"Captain Morehouse also reports that rich gold deposits had been reported made at a place called Santa Rosa, about forty miles from Tumbes. Two weeks ago he learned from a wealthy vessel at Tumbes, reported that while searching in the interior until their vessel should depart they made the discovery of good diggings on the bank of a small mountain stream. Encouraged by this success they made research in the bed of the river or creek and got good prospects, but hearing of their vessel's departure and the season being unfavorable, they returned to Tumbes with what gold they had got (about fifty dollars), which they sold at the rate of eighteen dollars per ounce. A large number of persons were intending to visit the mines in the proper season, the Peruvian government, however, being unfavorable to them further development through fear of a large emigration of foreigners, who have generally created trouble."

Religious Intelligence.

At a late meeting of the Managers of the American Bible Society, the Christian Commission received a donation of the Scriptures to supply General Rosser's army with 50,000 English and 10,000 German Testaments; General Grant's, 50,000 English and 10,000 German Testaments; General Burnside's, 25,000 English and 5,000 German Testaments; also, to the three armies, 2,000 Bibles and Testaments, in various languages, such as French, Italian, Spanish, &c.

There is a Congregational Church at Ridge, N. H., for which *forty-five* years has paid the pastor's salary in one sum on the very same day it became due, and nearly at the same hour of the day, except when pay day came on the Sabbath, and then the money was paid the day before.

"An Anglican Inquirer" has the following query in the Pittsburgh *Christian Advocate*: "It has all along been assumed, and perhaps never been disputed, that John baptized Christ with water, and yet to me the proof is, to say the least, by no means clear. On the contrary, very strong presumption may be raised against the prevalent idea, and unless I have overlooked some passage bearing upon the subject, it will be impossible for any man to furnish absolutely incontrovertible proof of the baptism of Christ."

The following from the Washington *Chronicle*, shows what a brave Pennsylvania woman accomplished at Chancellorsville:

During the battle of Chancellorsville, while everybody was fighting and running, falling, we noticed one in their midst who, although she was not fighting, was still engaged in a noble work. This one is "Mary," the vivandiere of the One Hundred and Fourteenth Pennsylvania volunteers, (Colly's Zouaves). She was to be seen in the thickest of the fight, binding up the wounds of the fallen, regardless of her own safety. —When the wounded were removed to a house on the field, she was there, and when that house was shelled and burnt by the rebels, she was there carrying out the wounded. Her dress is pierced by several bullets. All the wounded of our brigade look anxiously for her every morning at the hospital, for she makes daily visits there.

On that bloody field she was often to be seen with a crowd of Zouaves around her, while she was engaged in binding up their wounds. Mary will never be forgotten by the First Brigade of Birney's division.

A NEW INVENTION.—The Paris corresponds to the London Times says that a skilful engineer residing in Paris has invented a machine by which cotton rags of every description may be rendered fit for spinning. By this means rags, such as old sheets, shirts and pocket handkerchiefs, worth not more than 20¢, the 200¢ weight, can be converted into blue or red cotton equal to that imported from Egypt, while, though inferior to American cotton, brings a high price in the Havre market. It is expected that this invention will attract the attention of cotton spinners throughout France. One manufacturer of padding at Orleans, and a cotton spinner at St. Denis, have found it a success in practice. Other engineers have directed their attention to the subject, and it is not impossible that, through the power of machinery, European manufacturers may, to certain extent, become independent of America. This invention, which was unknown a few weeks since, is one of those which effect a revolution in industry and increase public wealth to an immense extent. When it is considered how many millions are expended in the purchase of raw cotton, and the short time the manufactured article lasts, any machine that can make worn-out cotton cloth available for fresh spinning must render great service to the manufacturer.

THE FREEDOMS AT WASHINGTON.—A portion of the Freedoms at present at the Congressional Camp in Washington are to be immediately employed in cultivating Gen. Lee's estate at Arlington, a large and abandoned farm in the vicinity of that city. It is proposed to raise a sum of raising money. It is estimated that ten thousand tons of forage for the use of the army can be raised this season in this manner with profit.
