A DESTRUCTIVE FIRE.—About half past eight o'clock, on Thursday evening last, the alarm of fire was sounded, when it was found to proceed from the Steam Saw Mill of Wm. Reagan, Esq., on Front street, in the upper part of this Borough. The fire spread very rapidly, and before any assistance arrived the whole building was enveloped in flames, and as our fire department has ceased to exist, little hopes could be entertained of saving the building and stock. The flames soon spread to the lumber piles in the yard, when the heat became intense, and for sometime endangered the surrounding buildings, but fortunately no high winds prevailed at the time, and they were saved with buckets. The entire mill was consumed, together with a large quantity of boards, &c., in the former part of the upper part of the mill, and it is not known how originated. The loss is estimated at \$25,000, which is partly covered by an insurance of about \$7,000.

DESTRUCTIVE FIRE.—WILLIAMSON.—Early on Sunday morning last a fire broke out in a barn owned by Es-Owning Packer, in Williamson. It was filled with hay and other combustible material, and was soon destroyed. The heat from the burning building was so intense that it set fire to the Mulberry Street M. E. Church, situated on the opposite side of an alley. The greatest efforts were made to save the church building, without avail, and it was completely destroyed. The church was valued at \$30,000, and was insured to the amount of \$3,500.
