day until a cure is effected. SHOULDER SPRAIN .- How can it be cured, M. B. Ans .- One of the most important elements in the treatment of shoulder sprain is rest. Time must be given for the in-jured parts to repair themselves, and this is best effected by diminishing their move-ments as much as possible. A horse which is sprained, then, should neither be turned out to pasture nor exercised.

parts hot fomentations should be applied for a couple of hours for several days in succession, and afterwards the parts should be rubbed with some mildly stimulating liniment, such as soap liniment or camphorated spirit.

FOUNDERED HORSES,-What will cure them, C. N. ANS .- A certain cure for founder in a horse is to stand him in water up to his belly. I have known it peacticed for fifty years; and swathing the legs in hot water, vinegar and sugar of lead, are all good to some extent; but a founder must be relieved suddenly, or the horse will show stiffness in his action and have deformed and callous tender hoofs. Water applied to the legs I do not consider a positive cure, the disease must be attacked at the root, by bleeding and purging; a few drops of blood taken from below the fet-locks will hasten his recovery.

KICKING IN THE STABLE .- What will prevent it, E. V. Ans.-This is a bad trick, for it not only keeps them from their rest, but disturbs other horses. Yet it is no serious objection ; a collar shank log, buckled with a small strap in the hollow of the pastern, usually stops them; if not, put on a strap and chain of twelve or fourteen inches long. This rarely fails.

SWEENY IN Houses.—Is there any cure for it, I. S. A. Ans.—Daily applications of part of the following stimulating limiment, will probably prove of service: Take of soft soap, five ounces; oil origanum, two ounces; water of ammonia, four ounces soft water, two pints. Mix the soft soap, ammonia and oil of origanum together in a mortar, and then add the water. Macerate for fourteen days, and pour off the clear liniment. It should be applied to the part with friction. It must be perseveringly employed for a length of time, and is usually attended with a beneficial effect.

TAPE WORM .- Do herses have tape worms, if so, what will remove them. N. P. B. Ans.—Horses are seldom infested with tape worms, but when a tape worm is passed by any animal, the parasite should be examined to see whether the head is not passed the parasite will grow again. Iron filings are sometimes given in cases where the tape worm is present. Three ounces of iron filings, and sufficient quantity of treacle and liquorice root (powdered) may be made into six balls, one of which should be given each day and then a dose of purgative medicine should be given.

BAULKY HORSES .- What will cure them V. D. T. Ans.-To cure a baulky horse, take him from the carriage and whirl him rapidly round till he is giddy. It requires two men to accomplish this, one at the horse's tail. Don't let the horse step out, but hold him to the smallest possible circle One dose will often cure him; two doses are final with the worst horse that ever refused to stir.

A BRUISE OR BLOW ON HORSES.—What shall be done, J. S. R. ANS.—Apply hot water a long time with wet cloths. Beef brine is an exceelent lotion for both sprains and bruises. A veteran among horses, claims that it will almost set a joint or heal a fracture. Wormwood or tansey lotions are also good.

SPAVIN IN HORSES,-ANS,-Rest and counter-irritation are the great essentiala in the treatment of spavin. Rest, by diminishing the movement of the joint, reduces the stress and concussion which it undergoes to a minimum. The counterirritation may be applied in the form of a blister which should be limited to the inner surface of the hock joint. Repeating the blister is advisable when much improvement does not result from the first one. ordinary cantharidine blister is efficient in such cases. In bad cases, especially when there is reason to think that ulceration of the joint surfaces exist, the firing iron is one of the best remedies that can be applied. Another mode of treatment is to pass a seton over the spavin. This is a little more difficult than the application of the firing iron, but it is sometimes very successful. The hock should be blistered after the removal of the seton.

HOW TO GET RID OF RATS AND MICE-A gentleman of large experience, and full as sureane as most of us, says he gets rid of rats by putting potash in their holes and runs. The poor wretches get it on their feet, and over their fur, then they lick it, and don't like the taste of it; burns them somewhat, and the more they see of it, the less they like it, ; so they clear out almost as soon as the application is made.
