the year, and kept out lu the future. They enter the tree only at the surface of the ground, and an examination will now tell whether they are there or not; but our ex-perience of trees about here is that they are pretty sure to be. If there, a saw-dusty sort of matter will be about the stem, which the grubs have ejected in their bor-ing operations. If within, make an uncercmonious call on them with a piece of wire. It need not be thrust in tenderly. After it becomes tolerably certain that the wire has made the acquaintance of each of these fat office-holders, the next thing to be done is

to see that no more are permitted to enter. The convention speakers say, what we have long said before them, that paper wrapped around the stem just under the ground, and just above, and then gas-tar-red, (but it is better without the tar if done

to benefit the orchards. In Montgomery county last year we saw trees thriving wonderfully on ashes a read several inches thick under the trees. Then ashes are ten filled with kitchen refuse, and probably the fertilizing property lies much in these and not in the ashes merely.

Then another trouble is from the codling moth; but it appears that a little labor in emptying bottles once a day does much to remove this. PRUNING FRUIT TREES .- On this subject, important to every fruit grower, we give the following seasonable advice by an old fruit grower. He says that he has been engaged in cultivating trees for the past-twenty years, and has pruned apple and pear trees every month in the year, and of be could always have the time to spare would prefer to prune in the month of June, for the following reasons:

"First, the wound made by the removal

of a branch at this season will heal sooner than one made at any other time of the year. Second, very few water sprouts will grow after pruning, and the fruit which re-mains will be much larger in consequence. Any person who is at all acquainted with the management of fruit trees, knows that if a tree is barked in June the wound will heal in a very short time. To prune in June, persons should wear rubber or other soft shoes, to prevent barking the branches. My reasons lengtot pruning in the spring are, we generally have high winds and co-pious showers, the winds dry and crack the new wound, and the rain enters and blackens it, which it does not do in June. Water sprouts will also grow, which will have to be trimmed off every season. You au, lest covering the wound with paint or have these materials at hand, and in June SPRING GOODS he does not need them."

THE SUNFLOWER.—The sunflower is useful for many purposes. There is no seed that chickens will fatten on so quick as that of the sundower. It will speedily cure colds, coughs and cramps. RHUBARS Pix. - Prepare the stalks by pee'ing off the thin, reddish skin, and entting in half or three-quarter-inch pieces, which spread evenly in your crust-lined tins. Sift on a little flour, to which add a bit of butter and a teacup of sugar, if for a large pie. However, when it is desirable to economize sugar, or when a very sharp, sour taste is not relished, a pinch of soda may be used to advantage, with less sugar, as it goes far toward neutralizing the acid. (We would here add : save all your surplus pic-plant, prepare as for use, and dry in the sun, as stove-heat turns it dark-colored. Soak and stew for winter use, with sugar and soda as above for pies. It makes also a nice sauce for tea.)

LEMON PIE -Take two lemons, four eggs, two spoonfuls malted butter, eight appointule sugar; squeeze the juice of mons, and grate the rind of one. Stir to gether the yolks. sugar, butter, juice and rind. Cover a plate with pastry, pour the mixture in, and bake till crust is done. Then bent the whites of the eggs to a stiff froth, stir into it four spoonfuls sugar, put it on the pie, and set it back into the oven for a delicate browning. This is for two common-sized pies.

Ham Toast.—Chop some lean ham, put

in a pan with a little pepper, a lump of but-ter and two eggs beaten; when heated through, spread it on buttered toast and serve hot.

TO KEEP HAMS IN SUMMER. - Cut in slices and trim off the rind and outside; fry it about half as much as you would for the table. Pack it tightly in Jars; pour over it the fat that has been fried out of it. close the jar tight, set it in a cool place, and when used, give it a second frying before
