

CALIFORNIA DELIGHTS. - There are many nuisances encountered by the farmer in this part of the world which do something to countervail the surpassing loveliness of the climate. Of these ants are one. Frequentiy food can be preseved only by being suspended in sacks, or placed in cupboards with their legs standing in water. But for many years the Western farmers have shot grouse, wild turkey and similar birds by the million, clearing them out of whole States, thus leaving

their fields to the mercy of all kinds of vermin, and now the grass-hoppers is the recoil of the gun. The only adequate antidote for these pests is a stock of fowls law, prohibiting the wanton destruction of birds in season and out of season for the next 20 years. Locusts may be very good eating, but the civilized stomach prefers to eat the birds that ate the worm.
