

A New Way to Care Belling. Some writers have held that the cause of balking is bad treatment I think this view partially false Some horses will balk any way, and some eannot be made balk. When a horse once commences to balk, the treatment will make but little differ-

ence. To illustrate: I had a fine, large, five-year-old mare that took a notion to balk I did nothing for her, and finally she got so she would balk almost every time I hitched her up. One of my neighbors had a four-year-old of a good deal the same style of a horse, that commenced to balk some time NO. 51. before mine did. Both of these had an indentation in their foreheads. Notice this : every horse that has an indentation in its forehead will balk! He may balk sooner, or he may balk
